Уважаемые кандидаты на обучение в Норвегии, внимательно прочитайте дополнительную информацию!

Кандидатам, желающим обучаться в Норвегии, нужно предоставить **2 комплекта документов** : 1 комплект это документы, которые требуются для Минобрнауки России (Международный департамент), они обязательны и должны быть представлены **на русском языке** – в 1 экз., 2 комплект (в 2 экз.: **оригинал+копия**) - документы, **требуемые принимающей стороной и на языке, который требует принимающая сторона** (присылается тоже в Минобрнауки)

1 комплект : Документы для Минобрнауки России на русском языке (в это году облегченный вариант):

1. **Письмо-представление высшего учебного заведения, подписанное ректором или проректором.**
2. Биографическая справка кандидата (справка - объективка) с указанием фамилии, имени, отчества, даты рождения, места рождения, данных российского внутреннего паспорта, домашнего адреса, контактного телефона и e-mail, с приклеенной фотографией 3x4 см.
3. Справка о знании иностранного языка или сертификат (для всех категорий кандидатов, за исключением преподавателей, рекомендуемых на языковую стажировку).
4. Копию загранпаспорта (первый лист с фотографией).

Каждый из перечисленных документов должен быть заверен печатью вуза (кроме п.4).

2 комплект для норвежской стороны

Документы для Норвегии предоставляются по общим требованиям, перечисленным в заявке (п.9, см. в приложении) + необходимо учесть требования выбранных вами норвежских университетов (из перечисленных в приложении).

Документы, требуемые Международным департаментом Минобрнауки России, и документы, требуемые принимающей страной, включая заполняемые на сайтах, присылаются на бумажном носителе.

При высылке документов складывайте их в указанном порядке.

Преимущественным правом пользуются кандидаты, ранее не участвовавшие в аналогичной форме обучения за рубежом. Окончательное решение о приеме кандидатов выносит принимающая страна-партнер.

Расходы по проезду до места стажировки (учебы) и обратно и по оплате консульских сборов при получении виз несет учебное заведение или командированный.

О письме-представлении:

Письмо-представление от российского университета на кандидата составляется в произвольной форме на имя директора Международного департамента Минобрнауки России Николая Рудольфовича Тойвонена, за подписью ректора или проректора (на бланке вуза).

Письмо-представление должно содержать следующую информацию:

1. Статус в вузе (студент: курс, факультет; магистрант: курс, факультет; аспирант: год обучения; научно-педагогический работник: должность, ученая степень, ученое звание)
2. Страна, в которую направляется кандидат, на какой вид обучения/работы (языковые курсы, языковая стажировка, научная стажировка, научная работа, бакалавриат, магистратура, аспирантура, работа в качестве лектора русского языка и т.д.), язык обучения, по возможности период обучения/работы (конкретные даты).
3. В случае, если известно место обучения (вуз) или место работы принимающей стороны, написать: название учебного заведения, факультет.
4. Почему университет рекомендует именно данного кандидата (заслуги).

Norwegian-Russian Scholarship Scheme 2017-18

Introduction

This announcement of scholarships is based on the Agreement between the Norwegian Ministry of Education and Research and the Russian Ministry of Education and Science, dated 27th April 2010.

Norwegian scholarship schemes are normally closely tied to institutional collaboration, preferably with strong linkage between cooperation in research and education. Since the Ministry of Education and Research cannot instruct the institutions to accept a candidate within a specific field, this scheme is based on pre-agreements with defined institutions. The institutions retain their right not to accept a specific candidate.

The total amount of available student grants annually is 30, 15 within Norwegian language and literature, 15 within other subjects. The grants can be awarded to students and academic staff at Russian institutions of higher education. Admission of a student for a two-year programme implies that the student is counted as grant recipient for two years, reducing the number of available grants the following year.

As acceptance of individual students cannot be guaranteed, it is suggested that the Russian Ministry of Education and Science recommends at least 20 students for language studies and 20 students for other studies, from which the grant recipients can be selected.

Grants are offered at the following institutions:

- Oslo and Akershus University College of Applied Sciences
- UiT The Arctic University of Norway (merged with Narvik University College)
- University of Bergen
- Nord University (previously University of Nordland)
- University of Oslo
- Norwegian University of Science and Technology

Norwegian language and literature (Article 3)

The Kingdom of Norway will offer up to 15 grants annually. Depending on the number of qualified applicants, some flexibility can be shown in the distribution of language student grants, within the total of 15. The grants can also be awarded to lecturers of Norwegian language and literature at Russian institutions of higher education.

Oslo and Akershus University College of Applied Sciences

Studies at Oslo and Akershus University College of Applied Sciences, on conditions equal to those of an exchange student. Only in the spring semester 2018, limited to courses at the Faculty of Education and International Studies.

UiT – The Arctic University of Norway

UiT has merged four times since 2009 and has four campuses: Alta, Harstad, Tromsø and Narvik. The applicants must identify relevant courses from the UiT study catalogue <https://en.uit.no/startside> and check at which campus they are taught. The distances among the campuses make studying at more than one campus impossible unless the course(s) are virtual.

NOR-0100 Norwegian language, literature and culture for international students- 30 ECTS (campus Tromsø)

Required qualifications:

- Minimum 1 year of completed studies in academic subjects at university level.
- Documented level of Norwegian equivalent to level III. The students must have studied Norwegian full time for at least one year before they may attend the course.
- Accepted documentation of level of knowledge is:
 - Examination in Norwegian from upper secondary school on the “Vg3-level” (“Knowledge Promotion” (Kunnskapsløftet) / Norwegian as a second language from upper secondary school on the “VKII-level” (“Reform 94”)
 - Level 3 examination in Norwegian for foreign students at Norwegian universities
 - Examination from the 1-year university college course in Norwegian language and culture for foreign students
 - Test of Norwegian, advanced level (known as “Bergenstesten”) with a score of at least 450, or with “Pass” mark after the introduction of the new scoring system beginning fall 2009.
 - or documentation of other proof of Norwegian language skills on a similar level.

- Admission for 1 or 2 semesters on the same conditions as for exchange or free-mover students. The applicant must identify relevant courses in the UiT study catalogue. <https://en.uit.no/startside>

For Russian specialists in Norwegian language/literature:

Up to two degree students may be accepted for the Master's Programme in Nordic Language and Literature. There are two options: Nordic language or Nordic literature. A bachelor's degree or equivalent is required. Additional requirements may apply depending on the courses selected. General study grants (Article 2)

A total of 15 grants will be offered annually. The grants include 6 weeks summer school, open studies for 1 or 2 semesters, and Master degree studies. Depending on the number of qualified applicants, some flexibility can be shown in the distribution of grants, within the total of 15.

University of Bergen (UiB)

Courses: Applicants can apply for courses listed under «Courses for Exchange Students»: www.uib.no/en/exchange-courses. Applicants will also find the courses that are eligible for support under the “Norwegian language and literature (article 3)” in this course list.

Required qualifications:

- Applicants must have completed a minimum of 60 ECTS credits (equivalent to 1 year of full-time studies) at university level by the time s/he applies.
- Additional requirements may apply, depending on the courses selected. Such requirements will be listed in the course descriptions online.
- Applicants must be proficient in the English language at *level B2 or higher* according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). This can be documented in one of the following ways:
 - Tests:
 - TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) with a minimum score of 87 for an internet-based test (iBT), 570 for a paper-based test (PBT) or 230 for a computer based test (CBT).
 - IELTS (International English Language Testing Service), academic test with a minimum score of 6.0.
 - Pearson PTE Academic test with a minimum score of 54 points.
 - University of Cambridge examinations:

- First Certificate in English (grade B or C)
- Certificate in Advanced English (45 to 59)
- Certificate of Proficiency in English
- Applicants can also document sufficient English proficiency if they have:
 - Completed one year of university studies taught in English, in Australia, Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, United Kingdom, or USA.
 - Completed a university degree in English language and literature.
- English (140 hours) from Norwegian upper secondary school: written and oral exam.

Nord University

Studies at Nord University at bachelor level for 1 or 2 semesters on conditions equal to that of a free-mover student.

It is the applicant's responsibility that he/she is qualified for the courses to which he/she applies.

Required qualifications:

- For studies at bachelor level, minimum 1 year of studies in academic subjects at university level.

All applicants must satisfy the requirements for English language proficiency. Proficiency can be documented in any of the following ways:

- English basic course from upper secondary school in Norway with mark 2 or better
- TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) with a minimum score of 500 points on the paper-based test or 60 points on the Internet-based test
- IELTS (International English Language Testing System) with a minimum score of 5.0
- Pearson PTE Academic test with a minimum score of 51 points
- University of Cambridge Examinations:
 - First Certificate in English
 - Certificate in Advanced English
 - Certificate of Proficiency in English

- In addition, applicants will have proof of sufficient English proficiency if they have:
 - Completed one year at university in an English-speaking country (Australia, Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, United Kingdom, USA), provided that the language of instruction was English.
 - Completed university education where the subject English comprised the main component of the course of study. (Bachelor grad)
 - Completed a master's degree in English.

Applicants to programs taught in Norwegian must also satisfy requirements for Norwegian language proficiency. Proficiency can be documented in any of the following ways:

- Norwegian (as a second language) in upper secondary school, "VG3-Level" with the mark 2 or better
- The Norwegian Language Test – Advanced Level, written examination with the mark "bestått" (passed) from the autumn 2009 or a score of minimum 450 points (tests taken spring 2009 and earlier)
- Level 3 in the Introductory Programme for Foreign Students at the Universities
- examination from the 1-year course in Norwegian language and culture for foreign students, taken at a university or a university college
- Norwegian test for Adult immigrants from VOX with result B2 in all four parts

Required qualifications:

- For studies at bachelor level, minimum 1 year of studies in relevant academic subjects at university level. Within Engineering, courses on a bachelor degree level will be mainly instructed in Norwegian, and will hence require Norwegian proficiency. Students within engineering on a bachelor level without Norwegian proficiency are not eligible to apply.
- For studies at master level, bachelor's degree or equivalent.
- Additional requirements depending on the courses selected (students must meet with the recommended and required previous knowledge for each course)

15 study grants are available for studies of Norwegian language and literature. 15 grants are available for other studies. Please consult the attached list of available courses for information on available studies, admission requirements, level of support etc.

For studies on bachelor level, the basic requirement is one year of university level education. For master courses, a relevant bachelor's degree is required. Only students who are currently enrolled at a regular university study programme or academic staff/teachers at universities or similar institutions are eligible for grants to summer courses. It is the applicant's responsibility to provide the required documentation, including proof of proficiency in English.

Applications for other studies than those available within the programme will not be considered.

Application deadline: 14 March 2017

The Norwegian Ministry of Education and Research is under no obligation to process applications which arrive after the deadline, which are incomplete or lack adequate or officially certified documentation.
